#### 5 LATE BIDS

- 5.1 Bids received late shall not be considered. A bid will be considered late if it arrived even one second after 11:00 or any time thereafter. The tender (bid) box shall be closed at exactly 11:00 and bids arriving late will not be considered under any circumstances. Bids received late shall be returned unopened to the bidder. Bidders are therefore strongly advised to ensure that bids be despatched allowing enough time for any unforeseen events that may delay the delivery of the bid.
- 5.2 The official Telkom time, which can be observed by dialling 1026 from any phone, will be used to verify the exact closing time.
- 5.3 Bids sent to the RAL via normal post or any other mechanism shall be deemed to be received at the date and time of arrival at the RAL premises (tender/bid box or reception). Bids received at the physical address after the closing date and time of the bid, shall therefore be deemed to be received late.

#### 6 PAYMENTS

- 6.1.1 The Contractor shall from time to time during the duration of the contract, invoice RAL for the services rendered.
- 6.1.2 The invoice must be accompanied by supporting source document(s) containing detailed information, as RAL may reasonably require, for the purposes of establishing the specific nature, extent and quality of the services which were undertaken by the Contractor.
- 6.1.3 No payment will be made to the Contractor unless an original tax invoice complying with section 20 of the VAT Act No 89 of 1991, as amended, has been submitted to RAL.

#### TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

Roads Agency Limpopo SOC Ltd (RAL) is a provincial road infrastructure delivery parastatal registered under the Company's Act of the Republic of South Africa. It has been established under its constitutive Act, the Northern Province Roads Agency Act and Provincial Roads Act 7 of 1998. RAL started operating in 1999/2000 financial year. Its main functions are planning, designing, construction, maintenance and control of the provincial road network. It owns and manages all the provincial roads, except municipal roads and National Roads. RAL is managed by the Chief Executive Officer who reports to the Board of Directors. Members of the Board are in turn reporting to the Shareholder, who is the MEC for Limpopo Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure.

#### 2. INVITATION

Roads Agency Limpopo SOC Ltd (RAL) seeks to appoint a suitably qualified, reputable, and experienced service provider on SMME and Labour data on all projects for verification and consolidation of Quarterly and Annual Performance Information Reports.

#### 3. BACKGROUND

RAL has a monitoring and evaluation unit responsible for verification of data collected of Local Labour and SMME from Contractor Development unit which are included in the Annual Performance report.

The verification and the correctness of the social targets and physical targets is important as the information will be subjected to an external audit by AGSA (Auditor General). The audited information will then be included in the Annual Performance Report.

Performance information indicates how well an institution is meeting its aims and objectives, and which policies and processes are working. Making the best use of available data and knowledge is crucial for improving the execution of government's mandate. It is key to effective management, including planning, budgeting, implementation, monitoring and reporting. Performance information also facilitates effective accountability enabling legislators, members of the public and other interested parties to track progress, identify the developmental areas for continuous improvement and better understand the issues involved.

As an ethically driven organisation accurate performance information is critical to management to track progress against the delivery of the annual performance and strategic plan, which will further assist in their contribution to the socio – economic development by connecting the people of Limpopo Province. RAL subsequently applied the Theory of Change to their planning process to identify 2 key implementation Programmes, which are the Administration and Road Infrastructure Programmes, envisioned to adequately support the core business and improve the road network. A few of the key outcomes and indicators linked to these Programmes:

Programme 1: Administration

- A capable, Ethical and Developmental State
  - Organisational Performance against planned targets
  - Clean Audit

Programme 2: Road Infrastructure

- Economic Transformation and Job creation
  - Number of square metres  $(m^2)$  of surfaced roads rehabilitated,
  - Number of Kilometres of gravel roads upgraded,
  - o Number of kilometres gravelled,
  - Number of Bridges completed,
  - Number of youths (18-35) employed,
  - Number of women employed,
  - Number of people with disabilities employed, and
  - Number of SMMEs contracted.
- Education, Skills and Health
  - Number of Local Workers Trained

Over the prior financial periods RAL management has received repeat findings against the performance information data, which directly impacts RALs performance against their plan, in respect of accuracy and completeness of information. Amongst others, some of the critical findings include:

- No supporting documents for the reported performance information targets achieved.
- Discrepancies between the reported performance information data and supporting documents.
- Inadequate record keeping of portfolio of evidence.

During the last financial year, 2022/23, RAL received unqualified audit opinion with minor findings, and aspire to obtain an improved audit opinion from AGSA.

#### 4. SCOPE OF WORKS

RAL seeks to appoint a Consulting and Auditing company to conduct an independent verification of performance information data reported for the financial year 2023/2024 which will assist management in ensuring a complete and accurate portfolio of evidence in respect of the key performance areas of RALs strategic and annual plan. The Consulting and Auditing company will assist in reconciling, validating, and requesting all necessary documentation required as evidence to support the performance scores and further verify the accuracy and completeness of the current performance results.

The functions to be performed by the company in respect of the verification and assessment, will include the following key areas of evaluation, on a quarterly basis:

#### **Risk Mitigation**

 Evaluation of progress against key risk and mitigations identified as per the 2020 – 2025 Strategic Plan.

#### A capable, Ethical and Developmental State:

- Consolidation and verification of RALs units performance against planned targets
- Comparative analysis of reconciled unit performance to the current reported achievement as per the Quarterly Performance report for the 2023/24 and 2024/2025 FY.
- Compile portfolio of evidence files that supports the performance reported information by units to validate the accuracy and completeness of performance information.

#### Economic Transformation and Job creation:

- Physical site visits to obtain evidence, imagery and GPS coordinates of:
  - Rehabilitated roads,
  - Upgraded gravel roads, and
  - Completed bridges.
- Completeness verification of signed certificates of practical completion and details of the work per site for all rehabilitated, gravel roads upgraded and bridges completed.
- Verification and consolidation of signed progress reports per site for all rehabilitated, gravel roads upgraded and bridges completed.
- Reconciliation, consolidation and validation of payment certificates related to the roads rehabilitated, gravel roads upgraded, and bridges completed.
- Consolidation and verification of employment registers per service provider executing the road rehabilitation, gravelled roads, upgraded gravel roads and completed bridge
- Descriptive data analytics to categorise and recompute the total numbers of employees per KPI area:
  - Number of youths (18-35) employed,
  - Number of women employed,
  - Number of people living with disabilities employed,
  - Number of SMMEs contracted,
  - Number of Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) jobs created,
  - Amount spent on employing labourers,
  - o Amount paid to SMMEs Contractors and Sub-Contractors,
  - Number of work opportunities created, and

• Consolidation and verification of training registers for local employees at sites of implementation by services providers appointed.

- 1.2.2 The score for functionality shall be calculated as follows:
  - Each panel member shall award values for each individual criterion on a score sheet. The value scored for each criterion shall be multiplied with the specified weighting for the relevant criterion to obtain the marks scored for the various criteria. These marks should be added to obtain the total score for functionality.
  - □ The score of each panel member shall be added together and divided by the number of panel members to establish the average score obtained by each individual respondent for functionality.
- 1.2.3 A bidder will be disqualified if the combined score for functionality fails to meet the minimum threshold for functionality as per paragraph 1.5.1.

#### 1.3 ELIMINATION OF PROPOSALS ON GROUNDS OF FUNCTIONALITY

1.3.1 Quotations that score less than <u>70 points</u> for functionality will be eliminated from further consideration. Marks will therefore not be awarded for their cost proposals or for preference.

#### 1.4 PRICE AND SPECIAL GOALS STATUS LEVEL POINTS

- 1.4.1 All remaining bids will be evaluated as follows:
- 1.4.2 The **80/20** preference point system will be applied. Points for price and Special Goals will be awarded in accordance with the stipulations in the Preference Point Claim Form in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022.
- 1.4.3 If appropriate, implied contract price adjustments will be made to the cost proposals of all remaining bids.
- 1.4.4 The point scored for the special goals status level for each acceptable bid will now be added to the price point.
- 1.4.5 The Evaluation Committee may recommend that the contract be awarded to the bidder obtaining the highest aggregate mark as determined by **1.4.4** or to a lower scoring bid on justifiable grounds.

#### 1.5 ADJUDICATION OF BID

1.5.1 The relevant award structure will consider the recommendations and make the final award. The successful bidder will usually be the service provider scoring the highest number of points or it may be a lower scoring bid on justifiable grounds or no award at all.
